

## Flushing Community Schools Extended COVID-19 Learning Plan Goal Reporting

Required by February 1, 2021 and by End of 20/21 School Year

**End of Year Report: June 2021** 

Goal Category	Goal Related to Achievement or Growth on K - 8 Benchmarks		
Reading Goal	All students (K-8) will improve performance in Reading/ELA from fall to spring as measured by NWEA. Students will NWEA test in fall, winter and spring.		
Fall to Winter Reading Comments	On average, 65% of our students made growth on the Reading NWEA test. Our students who have elected to attend the hybrid model made more growth than those who are attending 100% virtual.		
Fall to Spring Reading Comments	On average, 70% of our students made growth on the Reading NWEA test over the course of the school year. Students increased their growth by 4.71% since the spring. Special Education students came in under the average, having 63.86% of students show growth over the course of the year, but they made the most gains since spring testing at +11.55%. The students that elected to attend virtually for the whole school year lost ground since the spring testing and only 59% of students showed growth, 12% below the average. In-person students out performed virtual learners by 13.42%.		
Mathematics Goal	All students (K-8) will improve performance in Mathematics from fall to spring as measured by NWEA. Students will NWEA test in fall, winter, and spring.		
Fall to Winter Math Comments	On average, 74% of our students made growth on the Math NWEA test, compared to 70% that made growth from fall to winter in 2019. Our students who have elected to attend the hybrid model made more growth than those who are attending 100% virtual.		
Fall to Spring Math Comments	On average, 85% of our students made growth on the Math NWEA test over the course of the school year. Students increased their growth by 10.76% since the spring. Virtual learners were the subgroup showing the least amount of growth since, at only 4.82%, where the next lowest subgroup showed 8.64% growth, followed by 9.99%. English Learners showed the most growth at 14.39% since the spring.
